Bridget Moser will create a new work during her residency at SPACES that includes segmented performance and video sequences combined to generate meaning around ideas of wellness, tools designed for self massage, decline, the mall as research site, and one specific scene in season 6 of The Sopranos. This work combines strategies commonly associated with performance art, prop comedy, experimental theater, and dance.

You Opened That Can Now Let's Eat the Whole Thing builds on Moser's previous interdisciplinary projects exploring original text, sound, and found objects through installation and performance.

An exhibition of photographs and printed ephemera with a video essay at its center, Jacob Koestler's *Casual Water* weaves together various points of view to tell the story of an abandoned country club. Through interviews and multiple digressions, personal histories begin to reshape the understanding of a local landscape. What starts as a microcosmic study of a few acres morphs into a cinematic essay on larger themes regarding sense of place, fragility of memory, and the impermanence of natural spaces.



Video in America features recently digitized works from the Everson Museum of Art's collection paired with contemporary videos, in order to draw connections between video art being produced today and the influential, early work in the Everson's collection. The videos exhibited at the Everson will change each month, focusing on a different region of the country. This April, SPACES Executive + Artistic Director Christina Vassallo will present the cold mornings edge of the old viaduct at the Everson, including the work of Ohio-based artists Kelley O'Brien, Cameron Granger, and Rachel Yurkovich.

Concurrently, Love and Machines, curated for The Vault at SPACES, presents work by two Syracuse-based artists, Rachel Fein-Smolinski and Tom Sherman, along with work by Juan Downey and Antoni Muntadas from the Everson's Video Archive. Love and Machines explores each artist's interest in technology, surveillance, and power, as well as the body, community, empathy, and love.



The Vault functions as an intimate setting where audiences can experience a variety of video and audio art. Curated selections are added to The Vault on a quarterly basis.



AND WE LOVE THAT! SPACES will support artistic research and development taking place in Cuyahoga County through The Satellite Fund.


