### Dear You,

SPACES artists give us access to worlds that we otherwise might not have entered. The momentous projects that we presented in 2018, during our 40th anniversary year, showed us that we all live in a time as much as we live in a place.

The year opened with Julia Christensen's Waiting for a Break, which relied on a system of collaborators and networked cameras to investigate the health of Lake Erie, and Mahwish Chishty's moving rumination on U.S. drone strikes in her native Pakistan. Next, we presented 20/20 Hindsight = 40 Years, a group exhibition that celebrated the cumulative artistic effect of 4 decades of SPACES. This summer, Michael Rakowitz and 4 local artists showed us how the expression of grief—caused by state-sanctioned violence—can unite an otherwise segregated community. When you visit this season, artists Sarah Kabot and James Webb will help you move beyond what is broken to discover what could be.

These projects feel in many ways like they've been at least 40 years in the making. As we move past this milestone, I can't wait for you to see what happens during year 41.

### FORGETTING LESSONS

Sarah Kabot (Cleveland, OH)

OPENING RECEPTION NOV 16. 6 PM - 9 PM ON VIEW AT SPACES

The works by Sarah Kabot in *Forgetting Lessons* reflect the inevitable distortions and omissions occurring in the public recollection of distant but meaningful news events.

NYT 2015 is a new iteration of her series of photographic collages created specifically for the exhibition at SPACES. Each collage combines photographs printed within a cover section of an edition of *The New York Times*. The intricately cut images are reassembled into compositions reminiscent of ink stains or scribbles. Additionally, her newly created, large-scale sculptural installation recombines background elements of images printed in both *The Plain Dealer* and *The New York Times*, approximating architectural space.

### IT'S NOT WHAT IT LOOKS LIKE: AN AUDIO GUIDE TO GETTING LOST

James Webb (Cape Town, South Africa)

In Residence: Oct. 3 - Nov. 23, 2018

James Webb is using his residency at SPACES to explore ideas of reorientation and rejuvenation through personal studies and collaborative experience in Cleveland.

The voice and language—with their powers to beguile, persuade and disorientate, as well as their use in reframing objects and situations—are key to the artist's current investigations. Towards these themes, Webb will conduct interviews with Clevelanders and undergo what French philosopher Guy Debord might call dérive-like walking tours. His focused wandering, amusement, and disorientation in Cleveland will progress towards various artworks that could act as associative audio guides to his experience and findings.
